

Which Computer is Best for Video Editing?



For Apple Mac, models with the word <u>"Pro"</u> are designed for video editing.

- Central Processing Unit (CPU):
 Intel i7 Quad Core. Video editing uses a lot of processing power, so a powerful processor ensures smooth operation.
- Graphics Processing Unit (GPU): with Separate 2GB memory or more. This makes editing even faster.
- Random Access Memory (RAM):
 16GB or more. Raw video files are huge, sometimes a few GB in size. So we need enough processing memory to handle.
- Solid State Drive (SSD): At least 500GB. For speedier editing, use an external Hard disk drive for your footage.
- Memory card slot and USB port.
 For transferring video footage from camera to computer or to the external hard disk drive.

How to Transfer Videos from Camera or Phone to Computer

Create a Project Folder

Do this for every new video production project.

Transfer every file related to the video into this project folder, including:

- The raw video clips
- The music files and sound effects files
- Extra footage and image files

Everything else related, like scripts and project files.

How to **Transfer Video** Clips from Camera or **Android Phone** to PC

- Plug the Camera or Android Phone into the PC's USB port with the USB cable.
- 2. Go to File Explorer and select the Camera or Phone(unlocked) folder.
- 3. Go to the DCIM folder.
- 4. Open for the latest folder.
- 5. Drag and drop the video clips into your video project folder.

How to Transfer Video Clips from iPhone to PC

Or use Google Drive, Dropbox, WeTransfer or similar file sharing service.

- Plug the iPhone into the PC's USB port with the USB cable.
- Go to File Explorer and select the iPhone folder.
- 3. Go to the DCIM folder.
- 4. Open for the latest folder with the biggest number.
- 5. Drag and drop the video clips into your video project folder.

How to Transfer Video Clips from iPhone to Mac

Or use Air Drop

- 1. Plug in your iPhone to your Mac using the USB to Lightning Cable.
- 2. Open Photos if it doesn't automatically launch.
- 3. Click on your iPhone in the sidebar (left side of Photos).
- 4. Select your videos and click Import Selected.
- Drag and drop the video clips into your video project folder.

Video Editing Techniques for Beginners

"The goal of video editing is to clearly communicate a thought or feeling."

7-step Video Editing Process

- □ Transfer raw footage
- Look through clips
- **□** Split, delete and trim
- Keep the best. Delete the rest.
- □ Arrange sequence
- Add audio and visuals
- Prepare for distribution

Step 1: Create Project

TIPS FOR USING TEXT IN YOUR VIDEOS

- Make text large enough to be read on mobile
- Choose a font that matches your brand
- Use outline and shadow to stand out from the background
- Keep font size consistent throughout your video
- Get your point across in as few words as possible

Changing Speed

Try Slow, Fast, Freeze Frame, and Reverse

Eg.

Speed change - Hotel

Reverse effect - Thor

Reverse Effect - Japan

Adrian in Paris - fake

Try this

Adjust brightness and color

Step 12: Overlay Media Superimpose)

The next step is the final step.

Export your edited video, so you can upload it to the web.



Step 13: Export Video

The Art of Editing

Captivating the Viewer

The 3-part Story Structure

- 1. Beginning: Start in middle of the story, suck the audience in.
- 2. Middle: Explain how story got to that point.
- 3. End: End with a bang, thump, climax! The Call-to-action.

Tip: End each scene with an implied question. Begin the next scene by answering the question, then imply another question.

What's the message?

Who's the audience?

 Before you start editing, read your script again to recall the idea or feelings you intended to convey. Do your scenes support your message to your target audience?
